Winter Scam Watch: Stay Safe This Season

Scammers don't take the winter off and neither do we! A few weeks ago, we hosted 50 LiNK Club members for a "Scam Seminar". Our staff shared information on scams, new and old, along with helpful tips on how to stay safe. Here are a few of the most common tricks making the rounds — and how to protect yourself:

- Smishing texts that claim there's a problem with your account never click links or reply. Call us directly at 641-939-3407.
- Imposter calls or emails pretending to be your bank, a government agency, or a familiar company. We will never ask for your password, PIN, or sign-in code.
- Investment or "easy-money" offers promising quick returns. If it sounds too good to be true, it is.
- AI voice scams that sound like a family member asking for help. Always verify by calling the family member directly before sending money. Remember: if something feels off, pause and call us. We're here to help you stay safe.

tools available inside our mobile app, now's the perfect time to take a look.

Here are a few easy ways to stay secure and save time this winter:

Working For You


Kathy Balvanz Retirement (and 40 years at HCSB)


